DR. WILLIAM LANNON POOLE, JR.



William Lannon Poole, Jr. was born on March 28, 1939, and died at home in Eclectic, Alabama, on Feb. 5, 2016.

He graduated from the School of Medicine at the University of Alabama in 1964. Dr. Poole served two residencies at the Metro Health Hospital in dermatology, and finished his residency at the University of Alabama Hospital in Tuscaloosa. He served as a U.S. Army doctor and surgeon in a Mobile Surgical Hospital

(M.A.S.H. Unit) in the U.S. Army during the Viet Nam War. Dr. Poole was board certified in dermatology. His medical practice spanned 47 years, and his last years as a physician and surgeon were spent in Tallassee, Alabama.

Lannon Poole was an active member of the Episcopal Church of the Epiphany in Tallassee, where he served as a lay reader. He is survived by his wife Charlotte, as well as children and grandchildren. Memorial gifts can be made to Epiphany Church in Dr. Poole's name.
