Below is a wish list of items we need for this renovation project. We are asking you to help by contributing any like-new items you may have or those you wish to purchase for this project. We are receiving donations on February 5 and 12 and would like to have most of them in place by Sunday, February 19. **For the Nursery:**

- Crib (with safety factors)
- Changing table
- Rocking chair
- Playpen
- Curtains for two windows
- Rug, 12' or 14' by 9' or special mat
- Small refrigerator
- Outside signs directing parents to the Nursery

**For Sunday School Area:**

- Whiteboard
- Dry erase markers and erasers
- Folding table with adjustable legs
- Small chairs
- TV and DVD player so adults in room will know when to bring toddlers to Nave.

**Proposed room improvements:**

Move existing shelves to east wall near external door and enclose the shelves; erect chair rail around room and paint below chair rail with semi-gloss paint; create child mural on wall; beside front left door in Nave mount sign which reads (in small letters) "Nursery, Restrooms"; and construct shelf divider on gliders or chair wheels. The task force appreciates all gifts as they work to ensure that the nursery is appropriately designed and equipped for young children.
